Page 4 - Levels of Difficulty, Step Sequences

(1) Question: Feature 5 states "'Two different combinations of 3 difficult turns (rockers, counters, brackets, twizzles, loops) quickly executed within the sequence.'" Do the turns have to be done on one foot?

Answer: Yes, the three difficult turns of each combination must be done on one foot. The last edge of one turn becomes the first edge of the next turn. Two examples of different combinations of three difficult turns would be:

- right foot: forward outside counter; back outside rocker; forward outside loop
- left foot: forward outside loop; bracket; twizzle starting back inside

There cannot be a change of edge between the turns because a change of edge is a step.
