Cumulative Points Calculation (CPC) Judging System Clarifications

Upright Position in Spins that have a Maximum Level 1 or No Level

The below clarifications are regarding the program requirements for the 2011-2012 season. Once reviewing the document if you still have a concern that needs to be clarified, contact Skate Canada at coaching&programs@skatecanada.ca

This question concerns competition categories that have a maximum Level 1 in spins:

- (1) Question: In spins in which the skater begins with an attempted (or successful) sit or camel basic position and finishes in an upright position, what will the call be?

Answer: If the skater is not successful in completing 2 rotations in the camel or sit basic position but does complete 2 or more revolutions in the upright basic position, the Technical Panel will call a CoSp (Combination Spin) level 1. If there is another spin in the program with the same code (CoSp1), the Technical Panel will change one of the spins to a "spin with no level". The Technical Panel will decide which spin is the "no level" call based on the skater's planned program sheet, if one has been submitted. For example, if the skater has indicated a Sit Spin or a Camel Spin, the Technical panel will call the skater's intent for the spin (e.g. Sit Spin: SSp no level) and the other spin will remain a CoSp1.

If the skater has not submitted a planned program sheet, the Technical Panel will call both spins as CoSp1 and invalidate one of them according to which calls would be of benefit to the skater.
